THE SMITH CENTER SHINES SPOTLIGHT ON LOCAL TEACHERS AT INAUGURAL HEART OF EDUCATION AWARDS, MAY 7

More than 800 educators from the Clark County School District recognized for exceptional efforts

LAS VEGAS – On Saturday, May 7, <u>The Smith Center for the Performing Arts</u> honored educators from the Las Vegas valley as it hosted **The Heart of Education Awards.** The special event powered by **The Rogers Foundation** recognized hundreds of Clark County School District (CCSD) teachers who have gone above and beyond for their students and have greatly contributed to their education, livelihood and betterment.

In its inaugural year, The Heart of Education Awards recognized more than 800 finalists for their outstanding contributions. ABOUT CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Established in 1956, Clark County School District is the fifth largest school district in the country, educating almost 75 percent of all students in Nevada with more than 320,000 students enrolled in Kindergarten through 12th grade.
