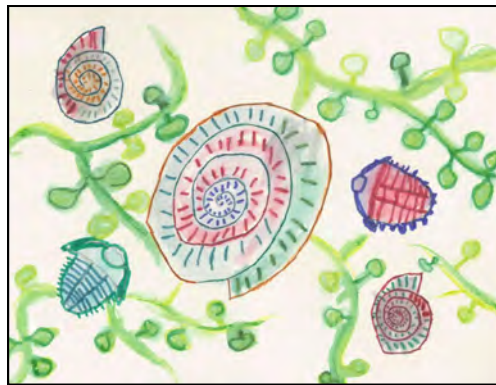

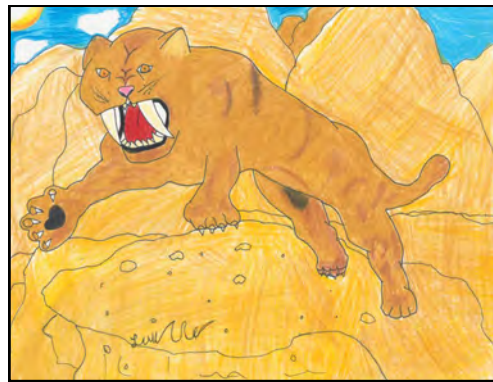

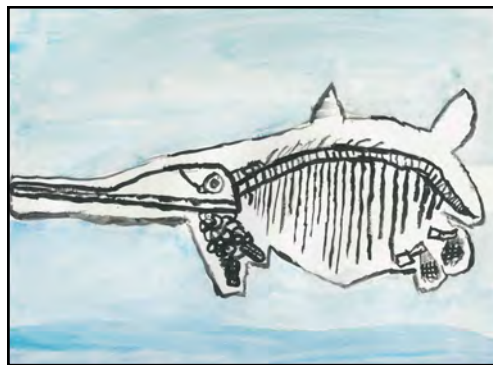

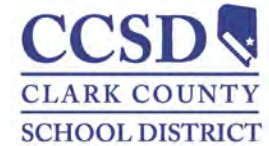


The National Fossil Day Art Contest

Protectors of Tule Springs is a 501(c)(3) based in Las Vegas, Nevada. In 2006, a small group of North Las Vegas residents joined together to raise awareness of the need to protect important fossil deposits against planned urban development. Together, along with community supporters, they helped spur legislation to create the Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument.
