CCSD Board of School Trustees meeting recap

Approval of Rebel TEACH program will allow students to earn dual credit toward a college degree in teaching

LAS VEGAS - Board Agenda Item 3.03 – MOU between CCSD and Board of Regents of the Nevada Systems of Higher Education on Behalf of UNLV, College of Education

The Clark County School District (CCSD) Board of School Trustees voted unanimously to continue a program that will offer CCSD students a head start on their college education by enrolling in University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV), College of Education courses while in high school.

Students from participating high schools will be offered certain approved courses that will qualify for both high school credit and a college credit in the program known as Rebel TEACH program. This is one of several CCSD initiatives to “grow our own” teachers by encouraging our own students to enter the profession.

The program will begin in the 2019-20 school year.

Board Agenda Item 5.02 – Three-Year Pilot Program - Principal Recruitment and Retention

Trustees voted unanimously to approve a three-year pilot program starting in the 2019-20 school year to recruit and retain principals at schools identified by the state as needing improvement. Selected principals will be provided with supplemental pay to work at the specified schools.

The schools in this program include:

- Jerome Mack Middle School
- Mario C. and JoAnne Monaco Middle School
- William Orr Middle School
- Marvin M. Sedway Middle School
- Ed Von Tobel Middle School
- Preparatory Institute, School for Academic Excellence at Charles I. West

The Memorandum of Agreement between CCSD and the Clark County Association of School Administrators and Professional-Technical Employees also sets student achievement goals the principal could reach in order to receive additional supplemental pay, including leading the school to increase at least two stars in the Nevada School Performance Framework
