DISTRICT ACCOLADES & INITIATIVES

- There were over **32,000 course enrollments** from students participating in a Dual Enrollment college credit program, about an elevenfold increase since the 2018-2019 school year.
- Over **21,000 students** enrolled in Advanced Placement courses, along with AP exam pass rates rising consistently.
- As part of CCSD's strategy to address chronic absenteeism, staff conducted about 4**5,000 home visits** this school year.
- Over **13,000 students had zero absences** during the 2024-2025 school year.
- More than **12,700 students** enrolled in Pre-Kindergarten.
- The No-Cost Community Market at the CCSD Family Support Center, in partnership with The Just One Project and Health Plan of Nevada, supports approximately 35 families monthly, delivering over 27,000 pounds of nutritious food to CCSD homes.
- CCSD partnered with The Public Education
 Foundation and Spread the Word Nevada to give over

 85,800 new books to more than 40,300 students
 through The Book Bus.
- Recognize A Valued Employee (RAVE) Review Program recognized 5,388 CCSD employees.
- CCSD was recognized by the National Association of Music Merchants as one of the Best Communities for Music Education for the 26th consecutive year.
- Nonprofit organizations and local municipalities have dedicated nearly 100,000 hours of volunteer work to our schools, representing a value of over \$9.3 million.

SCHOOLS

- Roger D. Gehring Academy of Science and Technology was honored as a National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education – the only Nevada school to receive this distinction.
- Blue Diamond Elementary School was one of two Nevada schools designated as a 2024 National Distinguished School for improving the achievement levels of disadvantaged children.
- Del Sol Academy of the Performing Arts won a top national award, receiving the Magnet School of America's Secondary Magnet School of Merit Award of Excellence.
- •41 CCSD magnet programs earned top honors from Magnet Schools of America.
- •86 schools earned a place on the CCSD Superintendent's 2024-2025 Honor Roll, receiving a 5-star rating or increasing their index scores by at least 10 points (100 possible points) on the Nevada School Performance Framework.
- Six CCSD schools were recognized as Governor's Designated STEM Schools; 33 CCSD schools have received this distinction to date.
- Five CCSD schools were awarded Purple Star designations by the Nevada Department of Education for supporting military-connected students.

NEVADA SCHOOL PERFORMANCE FRAMEWORK (NSPF)

- •200 CCSD schools increased index scores from 2023 to 2024 in the Nevada Department of Education's statewide accountability system.
- •80 schools increased their star ratings.
- Six schools jumped two stars: Lee Antonello, Crestwood, Lomie G. Heard, and William and Mary Scherkenbach elementary schools; and W. Mack Lyon and Jo Mackey Academy middle schools.
- James E. and A. Rae Smalley Elementary School earned a perfect score on the NSPF and has a 5-star rating.
